Helpful Information

BULK TRASH pickup is the first Monday of every month. Brush and bulk trash items must be placed out by 7AM. The earliest brush and bulk trash items can be placed out is the Thursday before the scheduled collection. Items must be placed at the curb in front of your home. Construction debris are NOT collected. See www.dallascityhall.com/ sanitation for more details.

No LAWN WATERING between 10AM and 6PM from April 1 to Oct 31. Also, the city of Dallas has a maximum twice per week watering schedule dictated according to the last digit of your address: even numbers - Sundays and Thursdays; odd numbers - Saturdays and Wednesdays.

PARKING should be on the side of the street you are driving on in the direction you are driving. Vehicles must be parked at least 15 feet from a fire hydrant and 10 feet from either side of a mailbox.

Please do your part to comply with city ordinances. For more details regarding the above or other topics please go to www.dallascityhall.com/code_compliance.
